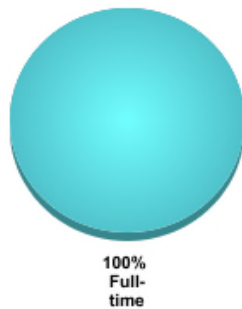

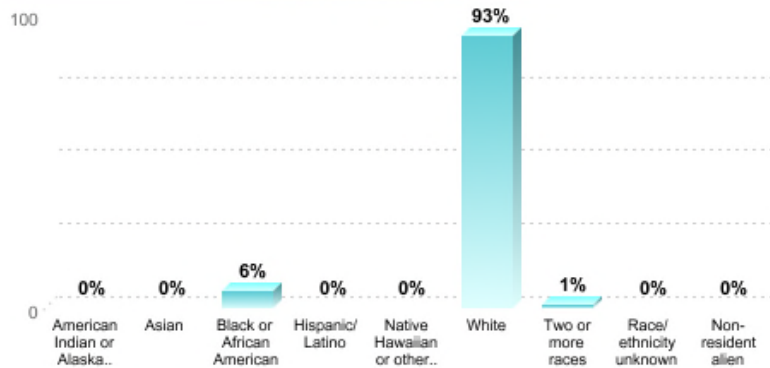
ATTENDANCE STATUS



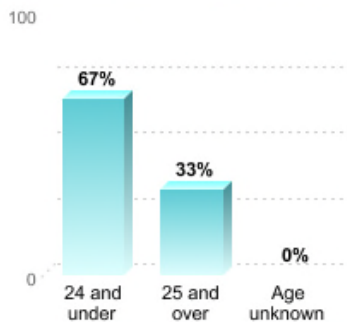
STUDENT GENDER



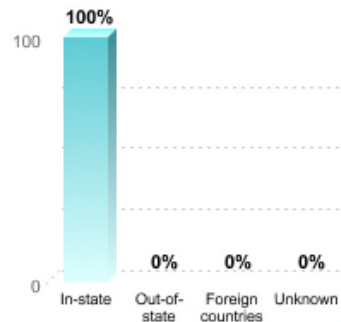
STUDENT RACE/ETHNICITY
